

# NatureScaping of SW Washington Wildlife Botanical Gardens

*"A Demonstration for Creating Backyard Wildlife Habitats"*

**The Wildlife Botanical Gardens** are a cohesive blend of specialty themed gardens, spread over three acres. The gardens, and devoted gardeners, demonstrate and teach gardening concepts that attract birds, butterflies, hummingbirds and other wildlife to residential gardens. Due to the extensive loss of bird and wildlife habitat over decades of urban growth, the gardens demonstrate how to take an active part in restoring our natural heritage by creating private backyard bird and wildlife sanctuaries.

Each themed garden is specifically designed to show people how they can turn their own yards into wildlife sanctuaries. The Wildlife Botanical Gardens include over 500 *species* and *varieties* of labeled plants. Special emphasis is placed on **native plants** of the Pacific Northwest. Each plant in the Gardens is in some way attractive to birds, butterflies, hummingbirds and/or other wildlife. Open from dawn to dusk seven days a week, the Gardens are a wonderful place to bring the whole family to visit.

## Entrance Garden

This Garden demonstrates over 200 different species and varieties of perennials attractive to birds, hummers, butterflies and other wildlife.

## Collector's Garden

Choosing the right place for the right plant, tree or shrub is what this garden is all about...choices. Delight in seeing old favorites as well as many new varieties as you search for that special something that would look perfect in your garden.

## Cottage Garden

This informal small lot provides ideas to successfully attract birds and other wildlife in higher density urban residences by using smaller varieties of bird favorites.

## Homestead Garden

This is an edible plant garden appetizing not just for our feathered friends but our human ones as well.

## Flying Flowers Garden

Incorporates flowering plants evolved to attract hummingbirds and butterflies by displaying a lovely swath of vibrant colored flowers: tangerine orange, rosy pink, brilliant yellow and red-hot scarlet.

## Hummingbird Garden

Hummingbirds are a delight to watch and this garden is filled with plants specifically selected for both the year-round Anna's and the migratory Rufous hummingbirds that live in Clark County

## Manor Garden

Reminiscent of the English formal garden, this garden uses many non-native ornamental plants in a way that is attractive to birds and other wildlife.

## Northwest Bird Haven

Featuring Pacific Northwest Native plants with low maintenance needs, this garden is for the birds. This garden provides seeds, nectar, fruit, berries, pollen as well as shelter for our local birds.

## Northwest Natives Garden

Visit the NW Natives Garden to see a variety of plants native to Western Washington. Design style is natural. Plants will remain mostly un-pruned to retain and promote their natural beauty. Leaves and other plants material will be left, as they are a vital part of the habitat cycle.

## Water Wise Garden

Filtering of storm water pollutants from the shed roof through a rain garden, rock garden and permeable paved path is the purpose of this garden. Plantings mimic meadow, open grassy areas to provide food, shelter, and overwintering sites for wildlife.

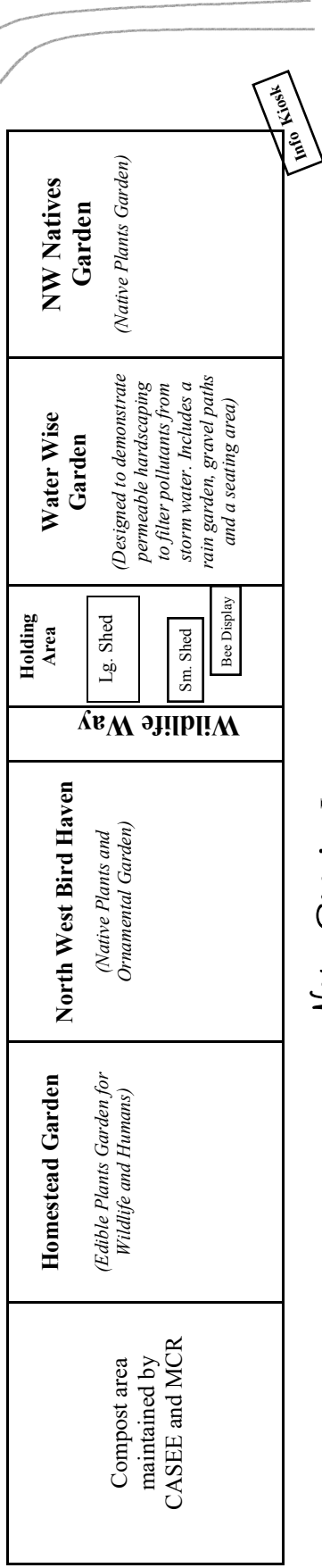

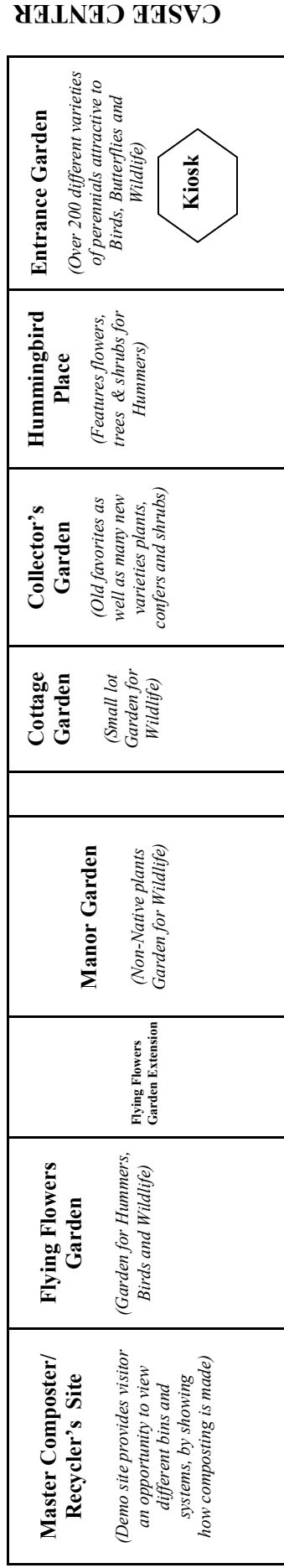
# NatureScaping of SW Washington
